Public Swimming Admissions Policy:

Children aged <u>8 years and older</u> who are unable to pass the swimming test must be accompanied by a parent or guardian of 16 years of age and older who is responsible for their *<u>direct supervision</u>, with a maximum of 3 children for each parent or guardian.

Children aged <u>7 years and under</u> regardless of swimming ability shall not be admitted to the swimming pool unless they are accompanied by a parent or guardian of 16 years of age and older who is responsible for their *<u>direct supervision</u>.

If the parent/guardian chooses not to be in the water:

- The child must remain in the small pool or
- If the child can complete the following Swim Test to the lifeguard's satisfaction, the child can remain in the big pool.
 - o Swim Test:
 - Jump into the deep end.
 - Tread water for 1 minute.
 - Swim 25 metres in 1 minute or less using a recognized stroke.
- If the child can not complete the Swim Test, he/she can remain in the big pool, but they **MUST** wear a lifejacket. If the child removes the lifejacket, the child must return to the small pool.

Please note:

The children to parent/guardian ratio:

- A 16 year old and older can bring up to 2 children
- A parent or legal guardian can bring up to 3 children

If the child will become 8 years of age by the end of the current year, he/she can challenge the swimming test. The lifeguard has the final decision.

If the guardian is under the age of 16 and possesses a current Bronze Medallion or Bronze Cross Certificate, he/she may stay with a maximum of 2 children. They must show proof of their certification at the front desk or to the lifeguard on deck.

*Direct Supervision - to be physically present; within arms reach of the children
